Background

Thurnham C.E. Infant School is a three-form entry school with a proud sporting tradition. The school will receive £17,800 in School Premium money for the academic year 2018-19. The school will use this money to ensure teaching staff are confident with teaching P.E, help class teachers to develop their own planning, oversee assessment and prepare teams and squads for inter and intra school competitions. Sports funding money will also be used to restock sports equipment and fund transportation costs for competition visits.

The funding is provided by the government to ensure impact against the following objective: To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools. With this in mind, we looked at improvement against the following five key indicators:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick starting healthy active lifestyles
2. The profile of P.E. and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching P.E. and sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport
