Maths Homework

- Homework may reinforce work done in school or it may be more general eg money or time.

- Not all Maths homework needs to be written down.

English Homework

- This reinforces work done in school and may be English based or another curriculum subject.
- Not all English homework has to be written down.

Spelling Homework

- Children copy 5 words into Spelling Book every
 Monday and will be tested the following Monday,
 using the words in a given sentence. The green
 Spelling Book is only to be used in school.
- The spelling rule for the week will be explained and a challenge will be given for those who learn the 5 words easily.
- Children will be expected to spell all of these words correctly in all of their writing.
- We will also send home approximately 15
 Common Exception words each term these must
 be learned and used correctly in all writing.
 They will be tested randomly throughout the
 year.

Reading at Home

- When will my child bring books home and when should they change their book?
- · What sort of books will they bring home?
- What if my child does not like the school reading books?
- Who should complete the Guided Reading Record book?
- What is the difference between fluency and comprehension?

Assessment in Year 2

Assessment is continuous, based on Government guidelines of

Working at the Expected Standard
Working at Greater Depth, within the Exp

Working at Greater Depth within the Expected Standard.

- Each child has individual targets which they work towards, both small steps and end of year targets.
- Expectations are very high but most children will reach the Expected Standard.
- Targets and progress will be shared at Parent Consultations.

End of Year Statutory Testing

- Some children will retake the Phonics screening assessment.
- Maths Arithmetic and Reasoning papers
- Reading 2 reading comprehension papers
- GPS one spelling paper and a paper to assess grammar and punctuation.
- · There is no separate written paper.
- The final assessment given is a Teacher
 Assessment based on a combination of test
 results and general work in school over the
 year.
